GOOD NEWS/BAD NEWS

Since the move to our present location our membership has almost doubled. However, the average donation (membership) has been reduced by fifty per cent. Therefore, our net gain in income has not increased. We had hoped to increase our membership as well as our income so that we could purchase more books and magazine subscriptions as well as pay the overhead for keeping Quatrefoil open to the public.

For this reason the Board at its March meeting voted to increase the minimum membership from \$10 to \$15 beginning April 1, 1988. Household memberships will become \$25 at the same time. In appreciation of the support of our present members, they may renew for another year any time before September 1, 1988 at the present \$10/\$15 membership. Members can check out books, games, videos, and audio tapes at no charge.

Perhaps it was a great act of generosity that so many of our first members gave us more than the minimum membership which helped us get the library rolling. We would certainly appreciate any who can afford to do so to consider giving more than the minimum amount.

We sent out renewal notices to forty of you in February and March. Do try to get them back to us as soon as posssible so we can continue to pay the bills as well as purchasing new books and magazine subscriptions. At present we are just keeping up with the monthly billsi
