FROM THE DIRECTOR

Travel and networking have occupied much of my time over the past two months. In March, I visited New York and met the executive director, board president and two members of SAGE. the social service organization for older gays and lesbians. Afterwards, I spent a profitable couple of hours talking with Donald Vining, who has worked on SAGE's oral history project for a number of years. Later, I went to Philadelphia to see Barbara Gittings, who has done so much work with the American Library Association to get gay materials in public libraries. Also, I talked with a representative of the Philadelphia Gay and Lesbian Library. (They have just moved and were not open when I was there. I plan to go back later this year when their new quarters will be open.) Of course, I visited some bookstores out East: New York's Oscar Wilde, A Different Light, and Gay Treasures - and Philadelphia's Giovanni's Room.

I recently spoke with Charles Botts from the MCC Library in Houston and the San Francisco Gay/Lesbian Historical Society about exchanging materials. Also, I have helped the new Gay and Lesbian Resource Center in Des Moines start their library. They plan to pick up the materials before the end of April. May I, I leave for Britain where I expect to do some networking in Edinburgh, Oxford, London. Next, I'll be going to Amsterdam. All in all, it has been a busy two months, but that is the way I like it. Hope it continues this way!
