WE'VE MOVED!

Quatrefoil Library moved into its new facilities on Sunday, March 24. We are now situated in the lower southwest corner of the building, Suite 105. The new space totals close to 2000 square feet, a 67% increase in space. This will provide separate areas for office, computer, meetings, storage and general use. The extra room will also allow us to set aside space for quiet reading, something that has not always been possible in the past. The meeting rooms will be available for use by groups in the community when they are not being used for Quatrefoil events.

BOARD NEWS

The Board and other committee members gathered on Saturday, January 20, for a day of long-range planning. We reviewed thew history of the library, and were amazed at how much had been accomplished in five years. We talked about our hopes for the library in the future, as well as some of our concerns. One of our dreams has already come to pass - the move to a larger and more flexible space.

The Board also held monthly meetings in both January and February. Our most significant decision was to move to the new suite. Other developments include opening the library on Sunday afternoons (1-5pm), starting sometime in late spring, and the adoption of a new video policy (see below). We also offered a complimentary group membership to students at Central High School. We are pleased that those students will have access to stories and information relevant to their lives as well as a supportive atmosphere in which to browse.

Other committee news: The Acquisitions Committee has openings for a few new members. Tasks include attending monthly meetings and leading one of more collection-related projects. Projects we are currently working on are: monitoring donated books, evaluating the collection, establishing an acquisitions procedure, developing ideas for grants and gifts and selecting materials to purchase. A one-year commitment is desired. To indicate your interest in this committee, leave your name and phone number at the library in care of the Acquisitions Committee.

BIBLIOPHILES WANTED

The Acquisitions Committee is looking for 15 volunteers to help evaluate Quatrefoil's collection. Each volunteer will be assigned a particular section of the collection. The project will consist of three related tasks. Part one will begin on April 20 with an orientation meeting and a preliminary review of the collection. In part two, volunteers will work on their own schedules to check resource lists to Quatrefoil's collections. The final part will involve writing a report and a collection development plan with a prioritized list of needed titles. Informal meetings will be held throughout the project to exchange information and support.

While subject expertise is helpful, a strong interest in learning about books, information resources and literature is the only requirement. The work these volunteers do will influence the growth in numbers and quality of the materials that Quatrefoil can provide to our community.

To volunteer, leave your name and phone number at the library in care of the Acquisitions Committee, specifying that you are interested in being a Collection Evaluation Volunteer. The orientation meeting is April 20, 9-12 at Quatrefoil.

QUATREFOIL ON THE AIR

On Thursday, March 28, Quatrefoil begins a regular bi-weekly feature on KFAI Radio's "Fresh Fruit" program. Twice a month, you can tune in to "Fresh Fruit" and hear reviews of books, find out who's writing what about topics of interest to our rich and diverse communities, and generally catch up on the latest in the library.

The first feature will introduce you to books that focus on how Gays and Lesbians have been portrayed in the media, particularly in film - a sort of historical precursor to the upcoming Gay and Lesbian film festival. On April 11, the subject will be children's books - for kids with Gay and Lesbian parents, and for Gay and Lesbian parents with kids. April 25 will be the first installment of "Coming Out books - Then and Now," a semi-regular feature.

Future shows will cover books on AIDS, religion, poetry and local authors. A frequent feature will be "Outing Dead Authors." There is more to come. Regular features for KFAI's "Lesbian Half-Hour" and GAZE-TV are being developed.

You can find KFAI at 90.3 on your FM dial. "Fresh Fruit" runs every Thursday evening for 7:00-8:00, followed at 9:30 by the "Lesbian Half-Hour" on "We Want You To Know." To find out times and channels for GAZE-TV in your area, call GAZE at 336-4006.
